Recently the signs that democracy is under attack in Canada, the USA and other well established democratic areas has become hard to miss. This appears to be true in Canada from the municipal level all the way up to the federal government as witnessed by recently publicized foreign attacks on our democratic process.

As a voter in Canada, I feel it important that any and all attacks on this institution, whether real or perceived, be investigated under the rules of law to ensure compliance and integrity.

As a result, I wish to submit an Application for Compliance Audit of Garry Michi's 2022 campaign finances incurred during the 2022 Ontario Municipal elections in the Town of South Bruce Peninsula.

Reasons for filing this Compliance Complaint

Item 3. Expenses not subject to spending limits
Office expenses incurred after voting day = \$1,278.92

This is deeply concerning. To claim \$1,278.92 appears significantly out of line and possibly offensive to the voters if compared to this candidate's pre-voting office expense of \$88.60. and the values submitted by all other successful candidates.

I would like to know what expense(s) Mr. Michi is claiming after the election was over. To claim a pre-election expense of \$88.60 and then a whopping \$1,278.92 after the election was over appears suspect. No other candidate running for any office claimed this expense. My concern is this amount may have been assigned to "office expenses" which is not subject to his overall spending limit.

Who cannot contribute - Ontario Corporations

"Cash contributions of \$7,500.00 from other candidates were from corporations".

88.8 (4) 3. – Who cannot contribute - A corporation that carries on business in Ontario.

I am unable to find any exceptions in the Act that allow for any corporate contributions even from the candidates own business.

"...two contributions from two individuals were in excess of \$1,200. These were subsequently allocated to two other individuals."

This statement in and of itself seems contrary to the spirit of the Act.

88.9 (1) – Maximum contributions to candidates - A contributor shall not make contributions exceeding a total of \$1,200 to any one candidate in an election.

I find no mention in the Act allowing a candidate to assign a partial contribution to another donor to make it legal.

"Furthermore, cash contribution of \$100 was received from an individual."

88.8 (8) — Contributions exceeding \$25 - A contribution of money that exceeds \$25 shall not be contributed in the form of cash and shall be contributed in a manner that associates the contributor's name and account with the payment or by a money order signed by the contributor.

These items are very clearly laid out in Mr. Michi's own audit report, signed by him, and all are clearly covered and easily found in the Municipal Elections Act.

Mr. Michi has, under his own signature, contravened every one of these laws.

<u>Advertising</u>

These coffee cards were apparently handed out at the drive-through in Wiarton on October 13, 2022. What is alarming is Mr. Michi's posted this event on his <u>campaign</u> Facebook® page (https://www.facebook.com/MichiForMayor1) but claims that the complimentary coffee was being distributed in honour of "World Kindness Day". If Mr. Michi did not claim this as a campaign expense, then I believe this may be a deliberate attempt to hide campaign costs. In addition, locals apparently met him campaigning inside the same Tim Hortons, where he distributed literature and ran a coffee tab with the cashier over a considerable amount of time.

On October 17, 2022, Mr. Michi posted on his campaign Facebook® page another event he attended in Oliphant where he gave out more Tim Horton® coffee cards. These events are clearly part of his election campaign and unless we see properly date and time stamped receipts, how we are to have any clue as to how much these events contributed to the overall \$700 advertising budget or how this may affect his maximum campaign spending limit?

In addition, Mr. Michi sponsored a Labour Day Weekend concert in Sauble Beach. This event was clearly published across social media. Mr. Michi is known to have paid the promoter for the opportunity to post his campaign signs across the venue and make a campaign speech on stage during the event. Once again, we need the cancelled cheque, not a handwritten receipt, to see what portion of his \$700 advertising claim was attributed to this one event.

Date and time stamped cashier receipts are required along with cancelled cheques or eTransfer statements, etc. This will provide legitimate clarity of these advertising expenses. Between all the purchased Tim Horton cards, the tab inside Tim Horton's and the concert sponsorship, I am concerned that Mr. Michi spent far more than \$700 which would make that an illegal claim. I am also concerned that the true costs of these campaign expenses may put Mr. Michi over his legal spending limit.

Conclusion

According to the Ontario Government website, the following is true of a person running for a seat in a municipal election:

"You are responsible for keeping records of the financial activities related to your campaign...You may want to consult with an auditor or an accountant early in your campaign to make sure that you are using a bookkeeping and accounting system that will suit your needs.

You should also look through the campaign financial statement (Form 4) that you will be required to file to make sure that you are keeping records of all the information that must be included on the statement."

After my review of Mr. Michi's financial statement and after considering the items listed above, I am concerned that in addition to accepting corporate donations, there is a possibility that Mr.

Michi has not claimed all expenses, expenses which might put him over his legal spending limit,

or he has allocated expenses to items not subject to spending limits in order to remain under

his limit. To not claim expenses contravenes the rules of the Act.

Mr. Michi is required to have itemized cash register receipts from Tim Horton's dated in October 2022 as well as the cancelled cheque for the sponsorship of the Labour Day concert.

In my opinion, Mr. Michi appears to have chosen to ignore the rules and directions laid before him. These rules are built on the backs of those that came before him and deserve extreme diligence and respect...not disregard, something the other candidates were able to abide by.

If the process finds the allegations discussed here to be true, it would mean that Mr. Michi has contravened the laws of this province and quite possibly did win the 2022 Municipal election illegally. To maintain the rules of the democratic process Mr. Michi's seat would logically need to be vacated.






