Public Notice

Please take notice that effective 12:01 am April 17, 2021, The Provincial government enhanced Covid-19 related restrictions. The following Town of South Bruce Peninsula facilities and operations are impacted in the following way, in order to comply with regulations and more importantly, help reduce the spread of the COVID-19 Virus.

Parks Facilities and Amenities Closed.

All outdoor playgrounds, play structures and equipment. All outdoor sports facilities and multi-use fields, including:

- Baseball diamonds
- Soccer fields
- Tennis
- Basketball courts
- Skate parks
- Fishing from public lands docks/piers

All portions of park and recreational areas containing outdoor fitness equipment. All outdoor picnic sites and picnic tables in park and recreational areas.

Parks Facilities and Amenities That Remain Open.

- Outdoor parks and recreational areas.
- Beaches open but no gathering.
- Off-leash dog areas.
- Benches in parks or recreational areas.

Note: Any person who uses any of the amenities that have remained open, shall maintain a physical distance of at least two metres from any other person who is also using the amenity, other than a person who is a member of the same household, a member of one other household who lives alone or a caregiver for any member of either household.

Town Buildings That Remain Closed to the Public

- Town Hall
- Wiarton Arena
- Sauble Beach Community Centre
- Both Fire Halls

Landfill Site

At this time, the Landfill remains open but is accepting payment only by debit "tap" and pre-arranged account. Curbside collection continues.

Building and Construction

Projects that can proceed:

- Are residential construction activities or projects and related services.
- Prepare a site for an institutional, commercial, industrial or residential development, including any necessary excavation, grading, roads or utilities infrastructure.
- Municipal infrastructure.

Note: Complete listing of projects and prohibitions is not yet available on Provincial web pages.

Secondary Residence/Cottages

The Province continues to discourage interprovincial travel. For people with a secondary residence/cottage, the Provincial regulations state; if a person needs to travel to their secondary residence, the trip should be for less than 24 hours (for only essential reasons, e.g. fix plumbing) or for at least 2 weeks. If you do need to come to your seasonal residence/cottage, you need to stay at your property, bring enough supplies to last and don't venture into the community. comply with Provincial and Local Health Unit Orders.

Short Term Accommodations

The Province has banned short term rentals except for those who have no other available housing. We remind those who rent to be aware of this Order as the Provincial fines are steep.

Transient Camping

Under current Provincial Order transient camping is prohibited (banned).
