Berford Street Reconstruction and Streetscaping Improvement Project George Street to Division Street

Happy Spring from the Big Dig Team!

This spring and summer we will complete the reconstruction and streetscaping on Berford Street. So what's on the agenda?

- Installing new watermains, sanitary sewers and storm sewers from William Street to just south of the George Street intersection and connecting properties to the new mains
- Completing the installation of the oil-grit separator on Division Street
- Installing new traffic lights at Berford and George
- Paving Berford Street from south of George to north of Division, and the areas we disturbed on the cross-streets
- Restoring the sidewalks
- Planting trees, flowers, installing benches...making sure that downtown Warton is a beautiful and welcoming shopping destination!

How long is this all going to take?

We will start work on April 12, with preparatory work and the installation of temporary water lines.

The first road closures will April 19, as early as possible after getting the go-ahead from the Ministry of Transportation.

If all goes according to plan, we should be finished by late summer or early fall.

Please Note:

If you live or work on Berford Street, be aware that construction and paving can cause vibrations. Please ensure any fragile items are secured and away from the edges of shelves!

How is the detour going to work?

A full road closure is initially planned from south of the George Street intersection to just south of William Street. This will begin on April 19.

Southbound traffic will route to:
Jenny Street to Gould Street to Frank Street

Northbound traffic will route to:
Frank Street to Claude Street to William Street

Barry: I love this town and the people in the community. I know it costs a lot of money, but the people who live here and the tourists have to drink the water so it must be safe. You can't play with people's health. I have a lot of respect for these guys (the workers). The work had to be done. You can't bring people in without new infrastructure. Warton is a beautiful community and it's time to fix it up.

- Division Street from Berford Street to Bayview Drive is still closed.

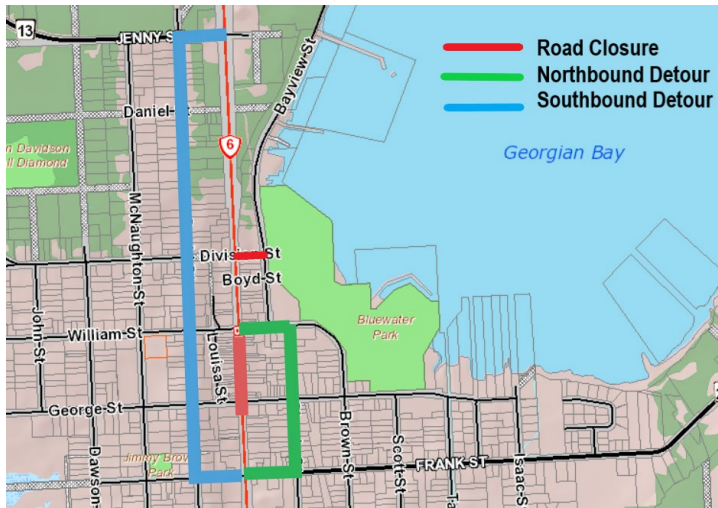
For the full road closure, traffic will be detoured on both sides of Berford whenever possible.

Southbound traffic will route to:

Jenny Street to Gould Street to Frank Street

Northbound traffic will route to:

Frank Street to Claude Street to William Street



Customer access to the businesses is provided via side streets, rear parking lots and pedestrian access. If you require special accommodation, please contact the business owner or the Project Ambassador for current accessibility conditions.

Business owners needing accommodation for deliveries should contact the Project Ambassador.

Access for emergency vehicles will always be maintained.
